
### **Lunch and Learn: Independent Methodist**

#### **Community Food Bank**



### FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2022

For the year 2022, the church received contributions (income) of \$975,000 or \$23,000 (2.3%) below budget. Contributions to the Uganda widow's homes, the new organ and all other designated contributions are recorded separately and not reflected in contributions. For 2022, designated contributions totaled \$147,000. Expenses were \$1,144,000 or \$146,000 (14.7%) higher than budgeted. As a result, the church used \$169,000 of its financial reserves during the year. The table below provides additional details, as well as a comparison to 2021. The church has no indebtedness on its facilities and \$50,000 as a loan balance for the organ.

Trustees spent \$413,000 or \$190,000 more than budgeted for maintenance and replacement expenses, including roof repairs, replacement of heating/cooling units, repairing leaks, replacing fire sensing and protection equipment and replacing the kitchen ice machine (as examples). Staff expenses were under budget by \$23,000 and Education was under budget by \$7,000. All other expense categories were each under budget by \$1,000 to \$3,000.

Thank you for being faithful to Trussville First in 2022. As the new year begins, prayerfully consider your 2023 giving plans. While the congregation is in discussions (discernment) about its relationship with the United Methodist Church, our missions and ministries continue uninterrupted.

# THE ACOLYTE BY: WILL NORTHERN



I was an acolyte for years in the church where I grew up. I enjoyed serving in that role, and I encourage all of our youth to participate in that capacity as it is a great way to begin service to the church. Every time I see a young person serving as an acolyte, I am reminded of a great lesson I learned many years ago. (My boys love to hear me tell this story. My parents too.)

In the church where I grew up, the acolyte sat next to the pastor during the service - practically facing the congregation the entire time. We were taught to look reverent and even a bit serious, and I did my best - other acolytes acted the same. My dedication to this principle would be challenged from time to time, by my Dad - who is now a retired Lieutenant Colonel - who would make faces at me to try to get me to laugh. He succeeded a time or two.

The acolyte would arrive early, light candles before service, stand next to the pastor during communion, and help clean up after the service. When I was 10 years old or so, I had just lit the candles using the same brass candlelighter that our acolytes currently use. I decided to snuff out the flame by blowing it out (instead of withdrawing the wick back into the candlelighter which immediately extinguishes the flame). As I did so, I felt a very slight sting directly on the bridge of my nose but only for a split second. I thought nothing more of it and went on with the service. Determined to put in a good 'show' as an acolyte that day, I sat up as straight as I could during service. During communion, I thought I was doing a great job because everyone that came to receive the elements stared and made direct eye-contact with me - they were noticing what a good job I was doing - so I stood up even straighter, carried a very 'pious' look (whatever that was), and said to myself, "I must be doing a great job!"

Later, as I was taking off my acolyte robe, I passed a mirror and something caught my eye. A closer look revealed a big blister - directly on the bridge of my nose - about the size of a black-eyed pea. It looked like an enormous pimple. Two things suddenly occurred to me: 1. the flame that I blew out must have somehow jumped back and touched my nose 2. I had been standing in front of everyone with a big blister on my face. That was what everyone was noticing - not the "great job" I was doing. I felt so silly and embarrassed. Our efforts to make ourselves look good can be so shallow. When we talk the talk and walk the walk, everything is great, but when we make a mistake, we feel exposed - like there's this side of us that we didn't want anyone to know about and now it's out there. The truth is, we all have this 'side' of us - but dealing with it in the open is a whole other matter, and can be difficult for many of us to cope with. If you are struggling with such matters, your Stephen Ministers are here for you. We partner with you as long as you need us to. Confidentially. Confidently. You need not stand in the open alone, any longer.
