CELEBRATE RECOVERY

Celebrate Recovery at Trussville First has hit several milestones! What milestones do you ask?

We have embraced new faces each Tuesday for the past three years. This is a major milestone because many CR programs only last a year or two before they stop holding meetings. This program requires a dedicated leadership team of volunteers who are constantly reaching out to those who might not realize they need such a program.

The second milestone is that Trussville CR has become known as a safe place to find healing from life's battles! Most people think of a recovery program only dealing with drugs or alcohol issues but at CR we also help with issues such as depression, anxiety, grief, eating disorders, abuse, neglect, abandonment, and many other such issues that hinder us from living an abundant life of joy.

The third milestone is that we average between 50 and 60 in attendance each week. Many new CR programs never reach this number in attendance. Many only have an attendance of 10 or less each week. Your CR program is a place where healed people are helping people in many ways.

The fourth milestone is that a new CR program was launched off of this one in January 2022 and they have become an anchor for recovery in their community also! Congrats to the Celebrate Recovery team at Faith UMC on having such a successful first year! We are so proud of y'all! We are praying over you and your program constantly! We look forward to having many decades of recovery ministry with your group and launching new CR programs together in other communities!

On January 3rd, 2023, we will celebrate these milestones and give God glory for the things He has done, is doing and will do through this program in the future! We have an amazing leadership team who speaks life into the lives that attend this program each week!

KIDS FIRST DAYSCHOOL



Kids First Day School's 3K, 4K, and School Age Program performed a beautiful Christmas Program on Thursday, December 8, 2022. The Children enjoyed learning about the birth of Jesus, a visit from Santa, the Grinch Day, watching a 4K play about Mary and Joseph, and doing good deeds to earn a piece of hay to add to our "Good Deeds Manger".

We are looking forward to begin the new year with lots of Winter themes and activities.

NOVEMBER FINANCIAL REPORT

Through November 2022, the church received contributions (income) of \$899,000 or \$16,000 (1.7%) below budget. Contributions of the Uganda widow's homes and the new organ (and other designated contributions) are recorded separately and not reflected in contributions. Expenses were \$1,047,000 or \$133,000 (14.5%) higher than budgeted. See the table below for details. To summarize the year so far, the church has spent just under \$149,000 more than it received.

Each year, the Trustees plan maintenance and replacement expenses as part of their annual budget. Unfortunately, unexpected repairs and replacements continue to outpace planned updates. Through November 2022, the Trustees have invested \$365,000 in repairs and upgrades to our physical plant or \$190,000 more than budget. Staff expenses are under budget by \$26,000 and all other expense categories are under budget by \$31,000. In December, approximately \$15,000 of this underrun in other expense categories will become due and payable.

By the time the newsletter is distributed, all 2022 contributions will have been received and expenses paid. The February financial update will provide a summary of the year's contributions and expenses. Thank you to everyone for your continuing support of the mission and ministry of FUMC-Trussville. Please remain faithful in your financial support as 2023 begins.

When I was growing up, I would do yard work for extra money. I had several neighbors who would pay me \$10 to \$15 to cut grass in the summer and rake leaves in the fall. I did NOT like raking leaves. Unlike cutting grass, it took me all day to rake a yard and bag the leaves.

One of my neighbors (Mr. Q) would pay me \$10 to rake his yard or cut his grass. His yard was not very big but his trees were Pin Oaks, which dropped these tiny sliver-like leaves which were particularly difficult for me to rake. Whether I spent an entire Saturday raking (we did not have a leaf blower) or cutting the grass, I got \$10. To my frustration, when I was finished, Mr. Q was never at home. I hardly ever got paid when I was done. I almost always had to go back and knock on the door to receive my pay. On one particular day, I was finally finished and very tired. I noticed Mr. Q's truck was there so I assumed he must be home. I was eager to collect. I repeatedly knocked on the door, and rang the doorbell - no answer. I knew he was there. I did not give up. I was determined that he was going to have to pay up on the spot this time.

Finally, the door opened but it was not Mr. Q but Mrs. Q. I had never met or seen her before this moment. She was riddled with Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA), a crippling disease. She could barely stand. Despite the pain she must have felt in getting up and coming to the door, she said very sweetly "What can I do for you honey?" I felt horrible, then and now. With kind patience, she explained that Mr. Q was running errands with his son and would be back later. I thanked her, said I was sorry about 20 times, and couldn't get out of there quick enough. To this day, anyone with RA has a soft spot in my heart. I fully expected Mr. Q to be upset with me for disturbing his wife, but he wasn't.
