Leaning Into The Light

So often we talk about God sending Jesus, the light of the world, to penetrate the darkness, and we think of that in terms of Jesus busting the dark tomb wide open at the resurrection. Now that is the climax of the Lenten season, but what were some specific examples of Christ bringing people out of the darkness while he was walking on earth? In this sermon series, we will look at some examples of how Jesus offered the light to people, and these people leaned into the light. We are now the light of the world and a city on the hill, but the only way we can remain that bright shining light is by leaning into the light of Christ. Listen: Praying in a Noisy World based on Rueben P. Job's book

If you are like me, you crave the moments of relief and silence, times when we don't have to worry or think about all the challenges, divisions, and conflicts we face on a daily basis. Nearly a decade ago, the late Bishop Rueben P. Job recognized similar challenges and wrote the book, 'Listen, Praying in a Noisy World'. His book is meant to be used as a six-week study, which works great during Lent. Reflecting on his writings, I believe his thoughts and ideas are just as relevant today as they were then. So, using his book as a guide, we will be working our way through listening and praying, seeing new leaders added and empowered by the Holy Spirit, and our call to bring about justice and restoration as a community of believers.




UMM Monthly Meeting

Solar Box Kits and Repair Water Wells

The Naomi Girls will be making solar boxes from kits to charge cell phones where there isn't electricity. This is their only way of communication. The solar boxes are sent to churches. While the people are waiting to get their phones charged, the pastor brings a sermon to the people. Hopefully, they will discover one day that Jesus has more power than the solar boxes.

Each solar kit will cost \$100. We will begin to assemble the kits when we can pay for 10 kits. Any amount of money is greatly appreciated, every dollar adds up. We will have an instructor to help us assemble the kits.

The repair of water wells is also important. The women are the ones that sometimes walk for miles with a large jug on their head to get water for their family every day. Ladies we are truly blessed! The repair of the water wells is \$1,500 each. We will continue to work with the nonprofit, Designs For Hope, with Chris Bond with our project.

The Naomi Girls would like to invite the Trussville First UMC family to help make these projects possible. Look what the TFUMC family did last year. You help to build 15 houses for widows in Uganda. You made a difference in the life of others. They were living on a dirt road.

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR JANUARY 2023

As we start 2023, the church received contributions (income) of \$74,000 or \$10,000 (12.0%) below budget. Expenses were \$64,000 or \$20,000 (23.7%) below budget. As a result, the church received \$10,000 more than it spent in January. Two items from January will be paid in February which will be slightly more than the additional cash received in January. The Trustees and Staff expenses were under budget by \$7,500. The table below provides additional details, as well as a comparison to 2022. The church has no indebtedness on its facilities and \$50,000 as a loan balance for the organ.

Thank you for your continued faithfulness to Trussville First as we enter the new year. While the congregation is in discussions (discernment) about its relationship with the United Methodist Church, our missions and ministries (and their related expenses) continue uninterrupted.
