DISAFFILIATION VOTE & NEXT STEPS

On Sunday, April 23, 2023, members of Trussville First United Methodist Church voted 296 to 83 (78% majority) to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. At the church conference scheduled for Thursday, May 11, 2023, we, along with over 100 other churches, will officially disaffiliate.

What's next for us?

Once our disaffiliation is official, we hold another vote to decide our new affiliation going forward—Global Methodist, Free Methodist, Wesleyan, or Independent. More information on that vote will be coming soon.

Until that time, please know that our Sunday services, outreach and programs will not change. We understand that this has been a very stressful time for Trussville First, but through this all, we will all be drawn closer together in prayer and scriptural like-mindedness.


Worship Tech Ministry

Solar Box Kits and Repair Water Wells

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR MARCH YTD 2023

The church received contributions (income) of \$206,000 or \$46,000 (18.2%) below the March year-to-date budget. Expenses were \$221,000 or \$31,000 (12.4%) below the same budget. As a result, the church has spent \$15,000 more than it has received year-to-date. The processor of electronic donations failed to forward approximately \$22,000 in contributions before the end of March. Had those contributions been received in a timely fashion, contributions would have exceeded expenses by \$7,000. The Trustees are under budget by \$17,000. Our Conference tithe (apportionment), paid a month in arrears, is below budget by \$11,000. All other expenses are \$3,000 under budget. The table below provides additional financial details, as well as a comparison to 2022.

On April 23rd, the Church Conference voted to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. In January, the North Alabama Annual Conference indicated that our church would need to pay \$187,804 to disaffiliate, less two types of payments which are in the church's budget to be paid monthly. Reflecting payments made through April 23rd, our cost to disaffiliate is \$147,327. The payment will be made on May 1st. After disaffiliation, the Conference will no longer hold any trust relationship on our property. The church has no debt now that the organ loan has been repaid.

Thank you for your continued faithfulness to Trussville First. Our missions and ministries (and their related expenses) continue as we remain Methodists but make the transition from the UMC.
