'Not A Fan' September 3 - October 8 Dr. Steve Strange The dictionary defines a "fan" which is short for "fanatic" as "an enthusiastic admirer." Now what the Scripture has called us to be is followers, not just fans of Jesus Christ. Fans follow close enough and want the benefits without the required sacrifice to be a part of the process. Fans mostly critique the team without investing or risking anything.

Fans will come to church sometimes, pray when they need something, and even put a Christian symbol on their vehicle to witness to the world. However, Jesus was never really interested in having admirers. He wanted followers that became fishers of men. This sermon series will challenge us to think about what it means to be a follower of Christ and not just a fan of Christ. We are going to take an honest look at our relationship with Christ and how we can be on the team, not just a fan of the team.

Jesus never asked us to sit and watch, he encouraged us to get in the game


